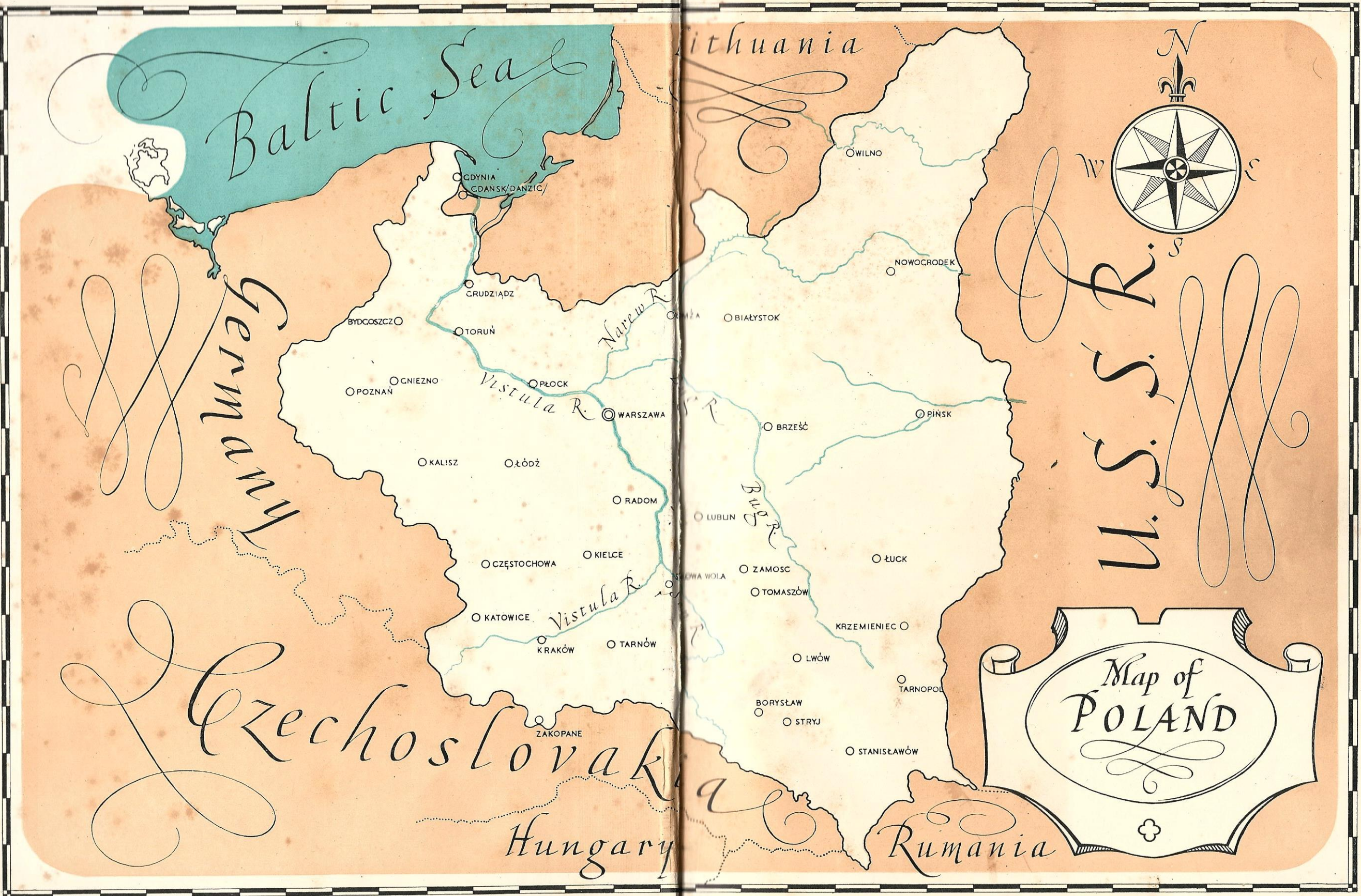

THIS book gives a sober account of Poland's achievements during the troubled period between the two world wars: 1919-1939. Restored to independent life after a century of foreign domination, Poland had to face tremendous problems of social and economic reconstruction. In a sequence of chapters we see an old but virile nation at work. Emerging out of the chaos of the four years' war Poland builds up a new unity of her national life, develops her natural resources, organises a system of social security, raises the standard of education, promotes learning and fine arts. 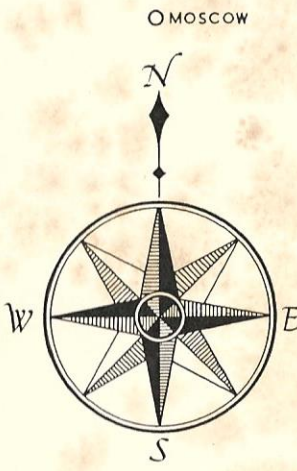
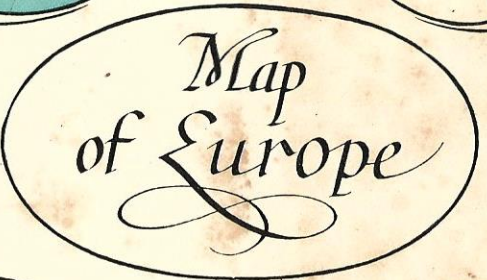
